# 1. Sheffield Priorities Progress Update

Good progress was reported against the discharge/home first model development with a programme outline drafted for presentation to HCP Board on 13 June. A weekly delivery group had been established to drive the work forward with membership from Sheffield Teaching Hospitals, Sheffield City Council and South Yorkshire ICB (Sheffield Place).

Programme Briefs for the remaining priority areas were under development and on schedule for presentation to HCP Board in August. Particular attention was being paid to ensuring an all-age approach was being taken for the neurodiversity priority, bringing together existing work from the children and young people and adult work areas.

The Sheffield ICB Project Management Team have worked with delivery group leads to complete a piece of work to illustrate how the expected impact of the priorities work will contribute to local and national asks (eg; Better Care Fund and Joint Forward Plan).

#### 2. Planning Update

An update was provided at the Transformation Committee outlining the draft Five Year Joint Forward Plan (JFP). Members of the Committee were given the opportunity to comment on the draft before it's submission to the South Yorkshire ICB Board in June. It was noted that the Sheffield Place Plan (which references the 5 priority areas) will be embedded within it as well as some local case studies.

It was noted that the JFP would be complimented by other strategies including a clinical strategy, children and young people's strategy and mental health strategy. In addition to this, South Yorkshire ICB are developing an outcomes framework to also sit alongside the plan. As this develops there was a commitment to review the Sheffield Outcomes Framework to ensure alignment.

A final draft of the JFP will go to the ICB System leadership Group on 13<sup>th</sup> June prior to final submission on 30 June.

### 3. Delivery Group and Organisational Updates

An update was provided by each of the Delivery Group Chairs and organisational strategy leads.

Escalations to Sheffield Health & Care Board are:





- Allocation of programme management resource remains the main issue for delivery. It is anticipated that some of the work of the delivery groups could be delayed due to this;
- Board to note changes within Sheffield City Council. <u>Sheffield City Council Document</u> <u>Memberships - Approved at Council on 17 May 2023;</u>
- Note good momentum in the Discharge/Home First Priority Programme of work and in the Community Inclusion and Development Delivery Group.
