#### 1. Sheffield Priorities Progress Update

Following the last Sheffield Health & Care Partnership Board, the Transformation Committee was tasked with reviewing the long list of identified priorities and working with the Delivery Groups to identify a specific set of four or five key areas.

The Committee discussed the overlap between the Delivery Groups and where we needed to be clear on leadership and resource for the different programmes of work.

Kathryn Robertshaw was identified to take the lead on working with the Delivery Groups on focusing their priorities and where the greatest impact was needed for 2023/24. The overview of the priorities will be presented at the next Sheffield Health and Care Partnership Board (18 April 2023).

#### 2. Planning Update

The South Yorkshire Integrated Care Strategy was signed off by the Integrated Care Partnership on 24 March 2023. An update was provided at the Transformation Committee outlining the objectives and the development of the Five Year Joint Forward Plan (JFP). The Sheffield priorities for 2023/24 will inform the development of the delivery plan within the JFP for years 1 and 2. The Transformation Committee wanted to raise the importance of ensuring that the JFP incorporates Sheffield Place specific priorities where we want to achieve transformational change for the Sheffield population. It is important to ensure that a person from Sheffield can read the JFP and understand how the delivery plans will affect them, rather than being too high level and not understandable to the public.

The NHS national planning requirements were coming to an end, with the final submission of financial, activity and workforce plans on the 30 March 2023. The Chair thanked all partners for their hard work in collating the plans and ensuring we meet the required national targets for 2023/24. There are a number of challenges and risks associated with the submission, which will be discussed at the next Transformation Committee meeting.

## 3. Deep Dive on Discharges

lan Atkinson led a deep dive session on hospital discharges. He presented slides from the National Discharge Team visit which took place on 20 March 2023. The Transformation Committee discussed the additional funding that had been allocated to the system and how this was being utilised to support the discharge process. It was agreed that a review of the different interventions would be completed to look at how we could work with the voluntary sector and community providers more in this space and how we might fund them in a more planned and sustainable way.

#### 4. Delivery Group Updates

An update was provided by each of the Delivery Group Chairs, with the main focus being on the delivery of current programmes and the development of the 2023/24 priorities.
